



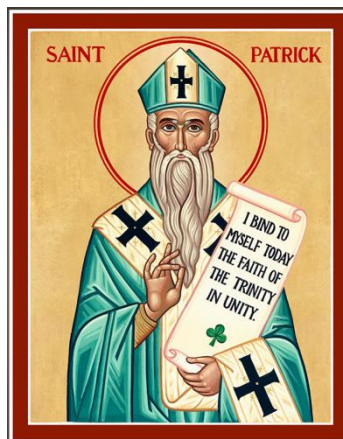

**The Collect of The Day:** Gracious Father, whose blessed Son Jesus Christ came down from heaven to be the true bread which gives life to the world: Evermore give us this bread, that he may live in us, and we in him; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

## The Nicene Creed

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

*Celebrant and People* Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

*The Celebrant continues* We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN.*

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us we are bold to say,

**Our Father** who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

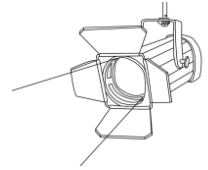

### CHURCH "CALENDAR" SPOTLIGHT



*From time to time as space in the bulletin permits, I will include a brief highlight about one of the Saints commemorated during the week.*



### **Patrick, Bishop of Ireland-March 17<sup>th</sup>**

Patrick was born into a Christian family somewhere on the northwest coast of Britain in about 390 AD. At 16, he was captured by a band of Irish slave-traders, taken to Ireland and forced to work as a shepherd until he escaped five years later. On his return to Britain he was educated as a Christian and eventually took Holy Orders as a priest, then Bishop, although no particular see is known to be his at that time. Around 432, he received a vision calling him back to Ireland, and he did return to the land of his captors. He spent the next 30 years until his death converting the Irish people- both kings and commoners alike- to Christianity. He established his principal church at Armagh which remains the primatial see of all of Ireland. There are many legends about Patrick which may or may not have a great deal of truth, but they do point to his strength of faith and his effective work as a missionary and cleric.

Almighty God, in your providence you chose your servant Patrick to be the apostle to the Irish people, to bring those who were wandering in darkness and error to the true light and knowledge of you: Grant us so to walk in that way that we may come at last to the light of everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
